

## Masks in Public Places

- **Requiring people to wear masks in stores, restaurants or other public places is in violation of several laws and rights.**

- **Masks are experimental medical devices** (defined by Section 201(h)) of the Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act) and need FDA approval, FDA regulation with proof of concept and efficacy to mitigate disease. So every single commercial, custom manufacturer or individual who is making their own mask would require "Federal Approval".

Most non-surgical face masks have not been cleared or approved by FDA, and the FDA only issued umbrella emergency use authorization (EUA) for most face masks. Therefore they actually are experimental medical devices.

- Forcing people to use masks as experimental and/or medical devices is in violation of **Article 6 of the UNESCO Declaration on Bioethics and Human Rights** and the **Nuremberg Code**, all of which have been adopted worldwide and are ingrained into our national laws. In addition it also is in violation of the **Civil Rights Act**, and the **Americans with Disabilities Act/ADA**.
